Get Your Phone Ready

Install the Battery

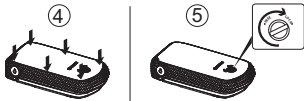
1. Using a coin, rotate the battery cover screw in a counter-clockwise direction as far as it goes (①).

Note: The battery cover screw is permanently mounted on the cover and cannot be removed.

2. Insert your thumbnail or fingernail into the slot and lift the battery cover gently (②).
3. Insert the battery, contacts end first, and gently press the battery into place (③).



4. Replace the battery cover, making sure all the tabs are secure and there are no gaps around the cover (④).
5. Using a coin, rotate the battery cover screw in clockwise direction until the cover locks (⑤).



Charge the Battery

Important: Before turning on your phone, fully charge the battery. Be sure to use the charger that came with your phone.

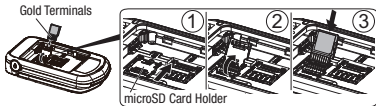
1. Open the cover to the USB/charging port on the left side of the phone.
2. Plug the smaller end of the micro-USB cable into the phone's USB/charging port.
3. Plug the other end of the USB cable into the charger, and then plug the charger into an electrical outlet.
4. When charging is complete, remove the cable from the port and close the cover. Press around the edges of the cover to ensure that it is securely closed.

Warning: Be sure all ports and covers are properly sealed to maintain the phone's waterproof capability.

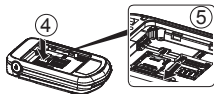
Insert the microSD Card

A microSD™ card is an optional accessory that allows you to store images, videos, music, documents, and voice data.

1. Remove the battery cover and the battery.
2. Slide the card holder in the direction of the arrow to unlock it (①).
3. Raise the card holder with your finger (②).
4. Insert a microSD card into the holder. Make sure to check the position of the gold terminals (③).



5. Gently press the card and the card holder (④), and then slide the holder in the direction of the arrow to lock it (⑤).



6. Place the battery back into its compartment and replace the battery cover.

Warning: Make sure you lock the battery cover properly to maintain the phone's waterproof capability.

Turn the Phone On

- Press  to turn your phone on.

Turn the Phone Off

- Press and hold  to turn the phone off.

Use Your Phone

Voicemail

Set Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls are automatically transferred to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. You should set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated:

1. Press and hold  in standby mode.
2. Follow the voice prompts to create your password and record your name and greeting.

It is strongly recommended that you set a voicemail password. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone can access your messages.

Retrieve Your Voicemail

- Press and hold  in standby mode.

From any other phone:

1. Dial your wireless phone number.
2. When your voicemail answers, press the asterisk key (*).
3. Enter your password.

Phone Calls

Make a Phone Call

1. Enter a number from standby mode.
2. Press  to delete one or more digits.
3. Press , , or the external speaker button.
4. Press  when you are finished.

Answer an Incoming Call

- Press  to answer an incoming call.
- When the phone is closed, open the phone to answer an incoming call.

In-Call Options

Pressing **OPTIONS** (right softkey) during a call displays a list of available in-call features. To select an option, highlight the option and press .

- **Transfer Audio** to switch the call to a Bluetooth device (if applicable).
- **Save** to save the current call's phone number in your Contacts.
- **Contact Details** to display information about the caller stored in your Contacts.
- **Main Menu** to display the phone's main menu.
- **3-Way Call** to open a call with two other parties.
- **Contacts** to display your Contacts list.
- **Phone Info** to display information about your phone.

Further options may also be available:

- ▶ Press **MUTE/UNMUTE** (left softkey) to mute/unmute the microphone.
- ▶ Press the volume button up or down to adjust the receiver volume.
- ▶ Press  or the external speaker button to turn the speaker on. Press again to turn it off.

Warning: Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Display Settings

Change the Wallpaper

1. Press  > **Settings** > **Display** > **Wallpaper**.
2. Select a wallpaper option by pressing the navigation key up or down, and select a wallpaper.

Sound Settings

Adjust the Volume

1. Press  > **Settings** > **Volume**.
2. Select **Incoming Ringtone**, **Playback Volume**, **Power Up/Down**, **Key Beeps**, or **E911 Alert**.
 - If you select **Power Up/Down** or **E911 Alert**, select **On** or **Off**.
 - If you select **Key Beeps**, select **Tone Volume** or **Tone Type**.
3. Select a volume level and press .

Tip: You can adjust the ringtone volume in standby mode or during an incoming call and the volume during playback by using the volume button.

Mute All Sounds

- ▶ Press and hold the volume button down in standby mode to activate Silence All. (The screen will display "Silence All.")

- ▶ Press the volume button up repeatedly to deactivate Silence All and select a volume level.

Select Ringtones for Incoming Calls/Messages

1. Press  > **Settings** > **Ringtones** > **Incoming Calls** or **Messages**.
2. Select **Contacts**, **Unsaved Numbers**, or **Private / Unknown**.
 - If you select **Contacts**, select **All Contacts**, or select **One Contact**, and then select an entry.
3. Select a ringtone option by pressing the navigation key up or down, and then select a ringtone.

Select Ringtones for Voicemail, Calendar, and Power Up/Down

1. Press  > **Settings** > **Ringtones**.
2. Select **Voicemail**, **Calendar**, or **Power Up/Down**.
3. Select a ringtone option by pressing the navigation key up or down, and then select a ringtone.

Select Vibrate Type for Incoming Calls and Messages

1. Press **OK** > **Settings** > **Others** > **Accessibility** > **Vibrate Type** > **Incoming Calls** or **Messages**.
2. Select **Contacts**, **Unsaved Numbers**, or **Private / Unknown**.
 - If you select **Contacts**, select **All Contacts**, or select **One Contact**, and then select an entry.
3. Select a vibrate type option by pressing the navigation key up or down, and then select a vibrate type.

Select Vibrate Type for Voicemail and Alarm/Calendar

1. Press **OK** > **Settings** > **Others** > **Accessibility** > **Vibrate Type**.
2. Select **Voicemail** or **Alarm/Calendar**.
3. Select a vibrate type option by pressing the navigation key up or down, and then select a vibrate type.

Contacts

View Contacts

1. Press **CONTACTS** (right softkey) from the standby screen.
2. Use the navigation key to scroll through the list to view your contacts.

Add a New Contact

1. In standby mode, press **CONTACTS** (right softkey) > **Add New...** > **New Contact**.
2. Enter a name for the new entry and press the navigation key down.
3. Enter the phone number and press **OK**.
4. Highlight a number type for the entry (**Mobile**, **Home**, **Work**, **Pager**, **Fax**, or **Other**) and press **OK**.
5. Press **DONE** (left softkey).

Edit Contacts

1. In standby mode, press **CONTACTS** (right softkey).
2. Highlight the entry you want to edit and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Edit Contact** or **Edit Group**.
3. Highlight the information you wish to edit.
4. Add or edit the information and press .
5. Press **DONE** (left softkey) or **SAVE** (left softkey) to save your changes.

Delete a Contacts Entry

1. In standby mode, press **CONTACTS** (right softkey).
2. Highlight an entry or a group you want to delete.
3. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete Contact** or **Delete Group**.
4. Press **DELETE** (left softkey).

Messaging

Send a Message

1. In standby mode, press **MESSAGING** (left softkey) > **Send Message**.
2. Select a recipient from the list or from the following options:
 - **Go to Contacts** to select a recipient from your Contacts. (Qualifying Contacts entries must contain a phone number or an email address.)
 - **MULTIPLE** (left softkey) to select multiple recipients. Press **CONTINUE** (left softkey) when you have finished selecting and entering recipients. (You may include up to 40 recipients per message.)
 - **NEW ADDRESS** (right softkey) to enter a recipient's phone number or email address directly. Press **CONTINUE** (left softkey) to proceed.

3. Compose a message.
 - Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) to select additional options.
4. To add an attachment, select **<Add Attachment>**. You can choose from **Picture**, **Video**, **Voice**, **Audio**, or **File Manager**.
5. Review your message and press **SEND** (left softkey).

Read a Message

- When you receive a message, your phone will display a notification message. Use your navigation key or select **View**.

Reply to a Message

1. While the message is displayed, press **REPLY** (left softkey).
 - Select **Reply to Sender**, or select **Reply All** if you are replying to a message with multiple recipients.
2. Compose a reply and press **SEND** (left softkey).

Bluetooth

Turn Bluetooth On and Off

1. Press **OK** > **Bluetooth** > **On/Off**.
2. Press **ON** (left softkey) to enable Bluetooth.
Press **OFF** (left softkey) to disable Bluetooth.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

1. Press **OK** > **Bluetooth** > **Add New**.
2. Select the device you wish to pair with and press **OK**.
3. Enter the passkey and press **OK**.
4. (Optional) Edit the device name and press **SAVE** (left softkey).

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth compatible devices.

Web

Go Online

► Press  > **Web**.

While connecting, you may see an animation before the home page appears.

Open a Web Page by Entering an URL

1. From any open Web page, press **Navigation** (left softkey).
2. Highlight the text input field on the top, enter a URL and press .

Manage Bookmarks

1. From any open Web page, press **Options** (right softkey).
2. Highlight an option and press :
 - **Add this page to bookmarks** to store the address of the currently viewed Web page.

- **View all bookmarks** to display a bookmark list. Highlight a bookmark and press  to go to the site.

Change the Launch Page to the Currently Viewed Web Page

1. With the Web page open, press **Options** (right softkey).
2. Select **Browser settings** > **Startup page** > **Use the last page I visited** > **Confirm** (left softkey).

Camera & Camcorder

Take a Picture

1. Press  > **Photos & Videos** > **Camera** to activate camera mode.

Shortcut: To activate camera mode, you can also press and hold .

2. Using the phone's main screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.

3. Press , , or **CAPTURE** (left softkey) until the shutter sounds. The picture will automatically be saved in the selected storage area.
 - To return to camera mode to take another picture, press **CAMERA** (left softkey) or .

Record a Video

1. Press  > **Photos & Videos**.
2. Select **Camcorder** > **Video Mail** or **Long Video** to activate camcorder mode.
 - **Video Mail** is limited to 25 seconds if Quality is set to Fine and 50 seconds if set to Normal.
 - The length of a **Long Video** will vary depending on the quality settings and storage type used (phone or memory card).
3. Using the phone's main screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.

4. Press , , or **RECORD** (left softkey) to begin recording.
 - Press **PAUSE/CONTINUE** (left softkey) to pause or resume the recording as needed.
5. Press  or **STOP** (right softkey) to stop recording. The video will automatically be saved in your designated storage area.
 - To return to camcorder mode to take another video, press **CAMCORDER** (left softkey) or .

This section contains important operational and safety information that will help you safely use your phone. Failure to read and follow the information provided in this section may result in serious bodily injury, death, or property damage.

General Precautions

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- To maximize performance, do not touch the portions of your phone where the internal antennas are located while using the phone.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Do not expose your phone to direct sunlight for extended periods of time (such as on the dashboard of a car).
- Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

- Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only Kyocera-authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Failure to do so may be dangerous and void your warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Do Not Rely on Your Phone for Emergency Calls

Mobile phones operate using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore you should never rely solely upon any mobile phone for essential communication (e.g., medical

emergencies). Emergency calls may not be possible on all cellular networks or when certain network services or mobile phone features are in use. Check with your local service provider for details.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Medical Devices

If you have a medical device, including an implantable medical device such as a pacemaker or defibrillator, consult your healthcare provider and the device manufacturer's directions before using this mobile phone.

Persons with implantable medical devices:

- Should always keep the mobile phone more than six (6) inches from the implantable medical device when the mobile phone is turned ON.
- Should not carry the mobile phone in the breast pocket.
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference.
- Should turn OFF the mobile phone immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in healthcare facilities, and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Using Your Phone On Airplanes

On airplanes, follow applicable airline regulations and always follow the flight crew's instructions concerning the use of your phone.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone off when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn your phone off when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone and accessories could generate sparks. Sparks can cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.

- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, flammable liquids, or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Note: Your phone complies with the Standards for Hazardous Location Equipment. Refer to the following section 'Using Your Phone in Hazardous Locations' for details.

Using Your Phone in Hazardous Locations

Your phone complies with the Standards for Hazardous Location Equipment as a Nonincendive Electrical Equipment for use in a Class I, Division 2, Groups A, B, C & D with a Temperature Code of T4.

Precautions

- Ensure that your phone is not exposed to the temperature outside the limits stated below.
 - Ambient Temperature:
-22° F to 140° F (-30° C to 60° C)
 - Charging Temperature:
32° F to 122° F (0° C to 50° C)
 - Storage Temperature:
 - Less than one month:
-22° F to 140° F (-30° C to 60° C)
 - More than one month:
-22° F to 113° F (-30° C to 45° C)
- Do not charge your phone in Division 2 hazardous locations.
- Use only the charger provided with your phone: battery charger SCP-42ADT and USB data cable SCP-17SDC.
- The audio jack, charger/data port, and battery covers must be properly sealed in Division 2 hazardous locations.

- Do not connect anything to the audio jack or the charger/data port in Division 2 hazardous locations.
- Do not open the battery cover in Division 2 hazardous locations.

Detecting Damages

If you suspect any compromise on the safety of your phone, immediately stop the operation and remove it from the hazardous locations. Some examples where the safety of the phone may be impaired are when:

- the exterior of the phone has a visible damage, or the markings or inscriptions are illegible.
- the phone has been damaged in transit, improperly stored, or subjected to excessive loads.
- malfunctions occur.
- permitted limit values have been exceeded.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it as they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your U.S. Cellular invoice.

Waterproof Capability

Your DuraXA is waterproof and meets IPX5, protection against sprayed water and IPX8 standards, submersible for up to 30 minutes at a depth not exceeding 1.8 meters (about 6 feet). Exposing your phone to water outside these limits or not following the precautions can result in water damage and will invalidate the Consumer Limited Warranty.

To ensure that your phone maintains waterproof capability, the following precautions must be observed.

- Make sure the charger/data port, audio jack and battery covers are properly seated, with no foreign objects obstructing the seals.
- Do not spray or immerse your phone in liquids other than fresh water or tap water, such as detergent, beverages, or chlorinated or treated water. Certain liquids such as salt water and chlorinated water are corrosive over time. Should your phone be accidentally exposed to other liquids, rinse the phone gently in clean fresh water.

- Do not expose your phone to water heated in excess of 104°F (40°C).
- Your phone is inoperable under water and should be dried as quickly as possible when wet.
- Do not use the charger/data port for charging, data transmission, etc. until the phone is completely dry.
- Do not use the audio jack to plug in an accessory until the phone is completely dry.

If your phone gets wet:

Water in the phone's open microphone and speaker ports may affect outbound audio quality and speaker performance. These are temporary conditions and will subside once the phone is dry.

1. Wipe the phone surfaces with a dry clean cloth.
2. Water in the phone's open microphone and speaker ports (small holes located at the top and bottom and grid of holes along the bottom front of the phone) should be removed with puffs of air directly into the ports. Phone audio may not operate properly until ports are dry. Apply a

dry clean cloth to the open areas and crevices to remove the moisture left on the phone: microphones; speakers; all physical keys; battery cover; audio jack cover; and charger/data port cover.

3. Repeat the process until the phone is completely dry.

Charging

- Dry your phone with a clean cloth before charging.
- Do not touch the charger, charging cable, or charger/data port with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock, injury, or product failure.
- Do not charge your phone in a wet or damp place, such as in a bathroom or near a kitchen sink.

Using Your Phone With a Hearing Aid Device

When some wireless phones are used with certain hearing devices (including hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a noise which can interfere with the effectiveness of the hearing device.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference noise they may generate. ANSI standard C63.19 was developed to provide a standardized means of measuring both wireless phone and hearing devices to determine usability rating categories for both.

Ratings have been developed for mobile phones to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing device. Not all phones have been rated for compatibility with hearing devices. Phones that have been rated have a label located on the box. **Your DuraXA has an M4 and a T4 rating.**

These ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and individual type and degree of hearing loss. If a hearing device is particularly vulnerable to interference noise; even a phone with a higher rating may still cause unacceptable noise levels in the hearing device. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements for hearing aid compatibility and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than unrated phones. (M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.)

T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. (T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Note: This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested

yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

Hearing aid devices may also be measured for immunity to interference noise from wireless phones and should have ratings similar to phones. Ask your hearing healthcare professional for the rating of your hearing aid. Add the rating of your hearing aid and your phone to determine probable usability:

- Any combined rating equal to or greater than six offers excellent use.
- Any combined rating equal to five is considered normal use.
- Any combined rating equal to four is considered usable.

Thus, if you pair an M3 hearing aid with an M3 phone, you will have a combined rating of six for “excellent use.” This is synonymous for T ratings.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Recently there have been some public reports of wireless phone batteries overheating, catching fire, or exploding. It appears that many, if not all, of these reports involve counterfeit or inexpensive, aftermarket-brand batteries with unknown or questionable manufacturing standards. Use only manufacturer-approved batteries and accessories. Buying the right batteries and accessories is the best way to ensure they're genuine and safe.
- Do not disassemble or open, crush, bend or deform, or puncture or shred the battery.
- Do not modify or remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion, or other hazard.

- Avoid dropping the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Do not short-circuit a battery or allow metallic conductive objects to contact battery terminals.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Battery usage by children should be supervised.

Charging

- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.

- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.

Storing

- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:
 - Less than one month:
-4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)
 - More than one month:
-4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) Batteries

- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-Ion battery as you can be burned.

- For safe disposal options of your Li-Ion batteries, contact your nearest authorized service center.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. Your phone is designed to transmit just enough RF power to reach the network. The system handling your call controls the RF power level. Depending on network conditions, your phone may operate at an actual Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) level below the maximum value specified. Your phone is designed not to exceed the recommended international guidelines for limits on RF exposure.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below.

In 1991–92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Body-Worn Operation

To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines, always use an appropriate accessory if using the phone for body worn

operations. Accessories used with this phone for body worn operations must not contain any metallic components and must provide at least **0.59 inches (1.5 centimeters)** separation distance between the user's body and the phone, including antennas. Body worn accessories that do not meet these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure requirements and should be avoided.

This device is not intended to be used with a lanyard or strap on the body. The device contains a mounting point that may be used to attach the device to equipment, a backpack or tool belt, etc.

Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) for Wireless Phones

The SAR value corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed into the head of a user of a wireless handset.

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much

RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6 W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.

The highest reported SAR values of the DuraXA are:

Head: 0.48 W/kg

Body-worn: 1.31 W/kg

In the US, the SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over 1 gram of tissue for the body or head.

Phone models may have different versions and more than one value. Changes in design or components may occur over time and some changes could affect SAR values. More information on the phone's SAR can be found on the following FCC website: <http://fcc.gov/oet/ea/>.
