Remove the back cover

If you need to insert SIM and memory cards, remove the back cover.

Caution: don't use tools to remove the cover - doing so may damage your phone.

Take off the back cover.

1. Turn your phone upside down. Put your fingernail in the notch on the bottom corner.
2. Press your thumb in the centre of the back cover.
3. Pry the cover off.



Remove the battery & put in the cards

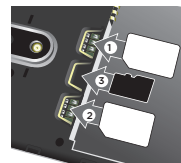
Caution: make sure you use the correct size SIM cards, don't cut the SIM card. Don't use tools to remove the cover - doing so may damage your battery or your phone. Both of the card slots support 4G/3G/2G data services, but you can enable only one SIM card for data connection at a time.

(SIM 2 is only available for moto e³ POWER)

Remove the battery.



Put in the SIM & optional memory cards.

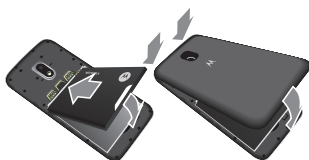

Put on the cover & power on

Insert an optional memory card. Put on the back cover. Charge your phone fully and turn the power on. Then select your language and follow the screen prompts to get started.

Put in the battery & put on the cover.



Charge up & power on.



Note: fully charge your phone before using it.

Press & hold Power until the screen lights up.

Battery life

Your phone is like a small computer that processes tons of information and apps at lightning-fast speed. Depending on what you use, that can take a lot of power.

When your phone is stationary, not charging or not in use for a period of time, unnecessary background processes are shut down to optimise battery life.

To see what's using up battery power, tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings** > **Battery**.

To turn on Battery saver, tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings** > **Battery**, then tap Menu (⋮) > **Battery saver**.

Note: to quickly open settings, swipe the status bar down with two fingers and tap .

Tips & tricks

To save even more battery life between charges, you could reduce:

- Bluetooth™ use: tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings**, then tap **Bluetooth** to turn it off when you don't need it.
- GPS use: tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings** > **Location** > **Mode** > **Battery saving** to turn off GPS tracking.
- Display brightness: tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings** > **Display** > **Brightness level** > (slide dimmer setting left). Make sure **Adaptive brightness** is also turned on.
- Display timeout delay: tap Apps (⋮) > **Settings** > **Display** > **Sleep** > (shorter setting).

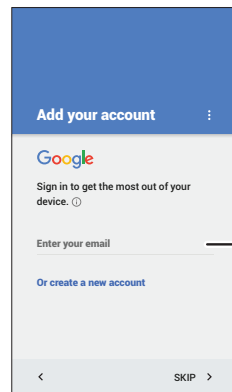
- Activity of seldom used apps: tap Apps (☰) > ⚙️ **Settings** > **Battery**, then tap Menu (⋮) > **Battery optimisation** > **All apps**. Tap the app you want to adjust, then tap **Optimise**.
- Widgets that stream information to your Home screen, like news or weather.
- Unused online accounts that you registered: tap Apps (☰) > ⚙️ **Settings** > **Accounts**. Tap the account you want to remove. Tap it again, then tap Menu (⋮) > **Remove account**.
- Recording or watching videos, listening to music or taking pictures.

Warning: don't try to remove or replace the battery yourself – doing so may damage the battery and could cause burning and injury. If your phone becomes unresponsive, try a reboot – press and hold the Power button until the screen goes dark, and your phone restarts.

Sign in

Just follow the screen prompts to get started.

If you use Gmail™, you already have a Google™ account – if not, you can create an account during setup. Signing into your Google account lets you access, sync and backup your stuff. See your Google apps, contacts, calendar, photos and more.

- **Wi-Fi network:** for faster internet access or to conserve mobile data use, swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap , and then tap **Wi-Fi**. There's more in "[Wi-Fi networks](#)".
- **Accounts:** to add, edit or delete accounts, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Accounts**, then tap  **Add account**. To set up email accounts, see "[Email](#)".

Quick start: Home screen & apps

The Home screen is what you see when you first turn on your phone. From here, you can explore apps and more.

- **Search:** type text in the Google Search box at the top of your Home screen, or tap  to search by voice.
- **Open app list:** to see your apps, tap Apps .



Swipe down with one finger for notifications or with two fingers for profiles and settings.

Search by typing or say "OK, Google".

Touch and hold an empty spot to change widgets, wallpaper and more.

Tap Apps  to see all of your apps.

Tips & tricks

- **Widgets:** to put widgets like a clock, interactive calendar and more on your Home screen, touch and hold an empty spot on the Home screen, then tap **WIDGETS**.
- **Pages:** to add a page, drag an app to the right-hand side of the screen until you see a white bar. You can add multiple pages. To show other pages of shortcuts and widgets, swipe the Home screen left.
- **Google Now™:** touch and hold Home . After setup, you can access it by swiping right from the Home screen. For more, see "[Google Now™](#)".
- **Settings:** to quickly open settings, swipe the status bar down with two fingers. To open more settings, tap .
- **Shortcuts:** tap Apps , touch and hold an app, then drag it to one of your Home screen pages. To see all your apps, tap Apps .
- **Apps:** to remove an app from a Home screen page, touch and hold the app, then drag it to **Remove**. The app isn't removed from your phone, just the Home screen.
To uninstall apps from your Home screen, touch and hold an app, then drag it to **Uninstall**. (You can't uninstall some apps, see "[Take care of your apps](#)".)
Tip: to quickly view app info, tap Apps , touch and hold the app, then drag it to **App info**.

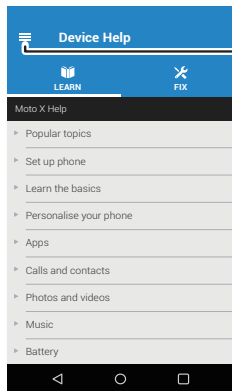

Search

When you type, suggestions appear below the search field:

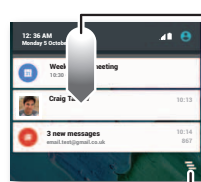
- To search for a suggestion, tap it.
- To search for text in the search field, tap ⓘ on the keyboard.

Tip: to close the keyboard, tap ∇.

Status & notifications

At the top of the screen, icons on the left notify you about new messages or events. If you don't know what an icon means, swipe the status bar down for details.

Tip: getting too many notifications? Touch and hold a notification to see which app is sending them to you. Then you can turn them off.



Swipe down to see notifications.

Tip: to clear just one, flick it to the left or right.

Clear notifications.

Tip: to quickly change common settings, swipe the status bar down with two fingers. For more, see “**Quick settings**”.

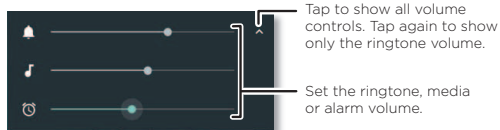
Icons at the top right of your screen tell you about phone status:

Network strength	Do not disturb
Wi-Fi in range/connected	Vibrate
Bluetooth on	Do not disturb
Aeroplane mode	Alarm set
Battery charging/full	Warning

Note: apps you download on Google Play™ might show other icons in the status bar to alert you to specific events.

Volume & interruptions

Press the side volume button up or down to select a volume from high to vibrate .



To turn off all sounds, except alarms, turn the volume all the way down.

Do not disturb

To access the do not disturb feature, swipe the status bar down with two fingers, and tap **Do not disturb**.

Tap one of these options:

- **Total silence:** turn off all sounds and alarms. Override sound settings from other apps. Set how long to stay in this mode, or choose indefinitely.
- **Alarms only:** set how long you want to only hear alarms, or choose indefinitely. Tap **MORE SETTINGS** to customise which other interruptions to receive.
- **Priority only:** set how long you want to only hear priority interruptions, or choose indefinitely. Tap **MORE SETTINGS** to customise which interruptions to receive.

Tip: to create an exception for repeat callers that allows a call from the same person within a 15 minute period, tap **MORE SETTINGS > Priority only allows > Repeat callers**.

Get music, movies, books, apps, games and more.

- **Find:** to search for apps, tap .
- **Download:** to download an app you found, tap it to see details, then tap **INSTALL**, or the price.
- **Share:** to share an app you found on Google Play, tap it to see details and then tap .

- **Reinstall:** to show or reinstall apps you downloaded on Google Play, tap > **My apps & games**.
- **Use a computer:** to find and manage apps from any computer, go to <http://play.google.com> using your Google account and password.

There, you can browse apps on the big screen, manage your apps across multiple devices (like a phone and tablet) and even set new apps to download to your devices.
- **Enjoy music, movies, books and more:** you can also use Google Play to download music, movies, books and more. See "[Google Play™](#)" and "[Play Music](#)".
- **Get help:** to get help and more, tap .

Apps from the web

You can get apps from other online app stores using your browser.

Tip: choose your apps and updates carefully, as some may impact your phone's performance – see "[Choose carefully](#)".

Note: when installing an app, make sure you read the alerts that tell you what information the app will access. If you don't want the app to access this information, cancel the installation.

To let your phone install apps that are not on Google Play, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Security** and tap **Unknown sources**.

Choose carefully

Here are a few tips:

- To help prevent spyware, phishing or viruses, use apps from trusted sites, like Google Play.
- In Google Play, check the app's ratings and comments before installing.
- If you doubt the safety of an app, don't install it.
- Apps use up memory, data, battery and processing power – some more than others. If you're not happy with how much memory, data, battery or processing power it's using, uninstall it.
- Monitor children's access to apps to help prevent exposure to inappropriate content.
- Certain apps may not provide completely accurate information. Take care, especially when it comes to personal health.

Set app permissions

You will only be asked for permissions when you use a feature in an app, instead of all at once when you install the app.

To modify the app permissions settings at any time, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Apps**, then select the app and tap **Permissions**.

To modify the app permissions by app type (such as Calendar or Camera) at any time, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Apps**, then tap **Settings** > **App permissions**.

Find it: apps , then swipe up to scroll through apps

Tip: your most recently used apps appear at the top.

To close the apps screen, tap Home  or Back .

- **Uninstall apps:** to remove an app from a Home screen page, touch and hold the app, then drag it to **Remove**. The app isn't removed from your phone, just the Home screen. Tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Apps**. Tap an app, then tap **DISABLE** or **UNINSTALL** (if available).

DISABLE removes the app from your menu – to **ENABLE** it, reopen this window and tap **ENABLE** (disabled apps are at the bottom of the list).

If an app locks up your phone as soon as you turn it on, restart in Safe Mode: press and hold the power button until the “**Power off**” pops up, and tap **OK**. Then, try removing the app.

- **Reinstall apps:** to reinstall apps on Google Play, tap Apps  >  **Play Store**, then tap  > **My apps & games**. The apps you downloaded are listed and available for download.
- **See app details:** tap Apps , touch and hold an app, then drag it to **App info**.
- **See app data usage:** to see which apps are using the most data, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Data usage**. For more, see “**Data use**”.

Update your phone

Use your phone or computer to check, download and install phone software updates:

- Using your phone:

If your phone notifies you about an update, follow the instructions to download and install it.

To manually check for updates, tap Apps  >

 **Settings** > **About phone** > **System updates**.

We recommend that you download updates over a Wi-Fi connection. Mobile updates can be quite large (25MB or more) and may not be available in all countries. If the mobile update is not available in your country, update using a computer.

Note: when updating your phone, make sure you have enough battery power to complete the update.

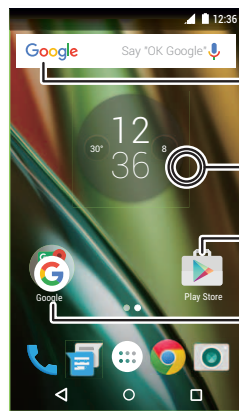

Take control of your phone:

- **Touch, press and speak:** learn phone gestures and commands. See "[Controls & gestures](#)".
- **Change your sounds and more:** to put widgets like a clock, interactive calendar and more on your Home screen, see "[Customise sounds & appearance](#)".



Swipe down with two fingers to see quick settings. Swipe down with one finger to see notifications.

Touch and hold an empty spot to change wallpaper.

Tap a shortcut to open. Touch and hold to move or delete.

Drag shortcuts on top of each other to make a folder.

Tips & tricks

- **Speak:** tap in a search window, or on a keyboard.
- **Add a Home screen page:** drag an icon to the right-hand side of the Home screen until you see a white bar. You can add multiple pages.
- **Quick settings:** to change **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth**, **Aeroplane mode** and other settings, swipe the status bar down with two fingers. For even more settings, tap **Settings**.
- **Can't find a setting?** Tap Apps > **Settings** > .

Controls & gestures

Touch

Find your way around:

- **Tap:** choose an icon or option.
- **Touch and hold:** to see more options.
- **Drag:** move items on the Home screen.
- **Swipe:** scroll through lists or between screens.
- **Pinch or double-tap:** zoom in and out on websites, photos and maps.
- **Twist:** twist a map with two fingers to rotate it and pull two fingers down to tilt it.
- **Back:** tap Back to go to the previous screen.
- **Home:** tap Home to return to the Home screen.
- **Overview:** tap Overview to see your recent apps (or browser tabs) and tap an app to reopen it. To remove an app from the list, swipe it left, right or tap . To scroll the list, swipe up or down.

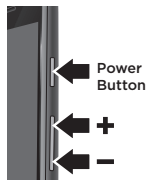
- **Menus:** when or appears on a screen, you can tap it to open options for the current screen.
- **Close keyboard:** to close a touchscreen keyboard, tap .

Press

Power button

Your power button helps in a few ways:

- **Power off:** press and hold the Power button to choose **Power off**.
- **Sleep:** to conserve battery power, prevent accidental touches or when you want to wipe smudges off your touchscreen, put the touchscreen to sleep by pressing the Power button.
- **Wake up:** press the Power button again.



Tip: to add security to your phone, see [“Protect”](#).

Volume buttons

Your volume buttons help in a few ways:

- **Ringer volume:** press the buttons when your phone is ringing to silence it.
- **Earpiece volume:** press the buttons during a call.
- **Music/video volume:** press the buttons during a song or video.

Tip: for more on volume control, see [“Volume & interruptions”](#).

Speak

Just tell your phone what you want.

Tip: speak naturally but clearly, like using a speakerphone.

- **Search:** tap on the Home screen to search by voice, or say, “OK Google” to speak your search.

To change your voice input and text-to-speech settings, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Language & input**.

- **Dialling and commands:** tap . To dial, say “Call” and then a contact name or phone number. Or, say a command like “Send text”, “Go to” an app or “Help” for voice command help.

Tip: if a contact has more than one number, you can say which number to call. For example, “Call Joe Black Mobile” or “Call Suzi Smith Work”.

- **Text entry:** on a touchscreen keyboard, tap , then speak your message or search text. You can also speak punctuation.

Tip: to make your phone read out loud, see [“TalkBack”](#).

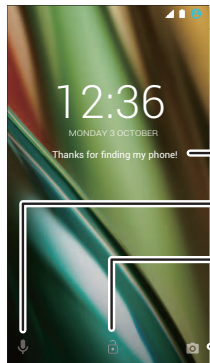

On, off, lock & unlock

Your touchscreen is on when you need it and off when you don't. To turn the screen on, press the Power button.



Add a lock screen message for anyone who finds your phone.
Drag up for voice assist.

Drag up to unlock your screen.

Drag up to open the camera.

- **Screen off and on:** press the Power button to turn the screen off and on.
- **Screen lock:** to unlock the screen, tap and drag up. To use a password, pattern or PIN security to unlock your screen, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Security** > **Screen lock** (see "**Screen lock**").
- **Notifications:** double tap a notification to open it. You'll be prompted to enter your passcode.

Tip: to choose what app notifications to hear or display. Hear: tap Apps > **Settings** > **Sound & notification** > **App notifications**, then tap an app.

Display: tap Apps > **Settings** > **Display** > **Screen notifications**.

- **Owner info:** to add a message to your lock screen, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Security** > **Lock screen message**. To set your message, just tap Back .

Tip: don't put your mobile number as your contact info unless you can access your voicemail from another device.

- **Screen timeout:** to change your timeout (screen locks automatically), tap Apps > **Settings** > **Display** > **Sleep**.

Customise sounds & appearance

Customise your phone's sounds and appearance:

- **Ringtone and notifications:** tap Apps > **Settings** > **Sound & notification**.
- **Vibrate or silent:** to make your phone vibrate for incoming calls, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Sound & notification** > **Also vibrate for calls**. To turn off ringtones for incoming calls, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Sound & notification** > **Phone ringtone** > **None**.
- **Ringtone for a contact:** to set a personal ringtone for a contact, tap Apps > **Contacts**, and tap the contact. Tap , then tap Menu > **Set ringtone**.

- **Message alert:** to change your message notification settings, tap Apps (☰) > **Messenger** > Menu (⋮) > **Settings**, and select **Notifications**.
- **Display settings:** to change brightness, animation and other display settings, tap Apps (☰) > **Settings** > **Display**.
- **Rotate:** in many apps, the touchscreen switches from portrait to landscape when you rotate your phone. To turn this on or off, swipe the status bar down with two fingers and tap **Auto-rotate**.
- **Language and region:** to set your menu language and region, tap Apps (☰) > **Settings** > **Language & input** > **Language**.

Redecorate your Home screen

For quick access to your favourite things, customise your Home screen the way you want.

- **Change wallpaper:** touch and hold an empty spot on your Home screen and tap **WALLPAPERS**.
- **Add a Home screen page:** drag an app to the right-hand side of the Home screen until you see a white bar. You can add multiple pages.
- **Add shortcuts:** tap Apps (☰), touch and hold the app, then drag it to one of your Home screen pages.
- **Create shortcut folders:** drag one shortcut onto another. Add more shortcuts by dragging them onto the first shortcut. To name the folder, tap it, tap the name and type a new name.

- **Add widgets:** to put widgets like a clock, interactive calendar and more on your Home screen, touch and hold an empty spot on the Home screen. Then tap **WIDGETS**.
- **Move or delete widgets and shortcuts:** touch and hold a widget or shortcut until you feel a vibration or see the icon expand if vibrate isn't on. Then drag it to another spot, another page or **Remove**.

Note: removing a shortcut from your Home screen doesn't uninstall the app from your phone.

Quick settings

For quick access to **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth**, **Brightness**, **Aeroplane mode** and other settings, swipe the status bar down or the lock screen with two fingers. For even more settings, tap .

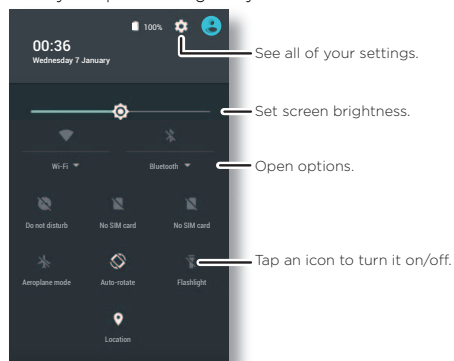

Quick start: accessibility

Accessibility features are there for everyone, helping to make things easier.

Find it: apps > **Settings** > **Accessibility**

Note: for general information, accessories and more, visit www.motorola.com/accessibility.

Tip: google Play has many apps that provide useful accessibility features. See “**Google Play™**”.

Voice recognition

Just tell your phone what you'd like to do – dial, browse, search, send a text and more. Tap at the top of the Home screen for voice search.

TalkBack

Use TalkBack to read your screen out loud – your navigation, your selections, even your books.

To turn on TalkBack, tap Apps > **Settings** >

Accessibility > **TalkBack**, then tap the switch to turn it on.

Note: you might need to download text-to-speech software (data charges may apply).

- **Tap** something on the screen to hear a description or text readout.
- **Double-tap** anywhere on the screen to open or activate the last touched item.
- **Swipe** using two fingers to scroll through lists or between screens.

Tip: navigate through your apps and menus to hear how voice readouts work on your phone.

To turn off TalkBack, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Accessibility** > **TalkBack**, then tap the switch to turn it off.

Braille

Combine your Braille display with TalkBack for braille and speech feedback.

- 1 Download the Google BrailleBack™ app from Google Play (tap Apps → **Play Store**) and install it on your phone.
- 2 Tap Apps → **Settings** → **Accessibility** → **BrailleBack**.
- 3 Turn on your Braille display and put it in Bluetooth™ pairing mode.
- 4 On your phone, tap Apps → **Settings** → **Bluetooth**, then tap the Bluetooth switch to turn it on and scan.
- 5 Tap the name of your Braille display to pair it with the phone.

Accessibility shortcut

Use simple gestures to quickly activate TalkBack and other accessibility features on your phone. For more information, tap Apps > **Settings** > **Accessibility** > **Accessibility shortcut**.

Caller ID

When you want to hear who's calling:

Volume & vibrate

Display brightness

Your phone automatically adjusts the screen brightness when you're in bright or dark places. But you can set your own brightness level instead:

Swipe the status bar down with two fingers and slide the bar to adjust.

Note: setting brightness to a high level decreases your phone's battery life.

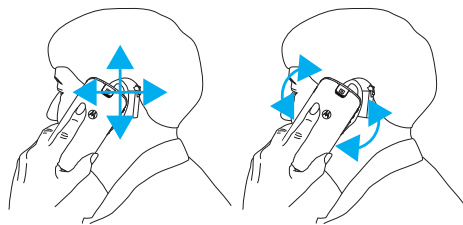

- **Answer a call:** when your phone is unlocked, tap **ANSWER**.

Note: when your phone is locked, swipe right to answer a call.

With call waiting, tap and drag to to answer the new call, then tap **Hold current call + Answer** or **End current call + Answer**.

- **Ignore a call:** when your phone is unlocked, tap **DISMISS**. If locked, swipe left to send the call to voicemail. You can also press the Power button to ignore the call or press a volume button to silence the ringer.
- **Respond with a text:** to send a pre-set message to an incoming caller, tap the caller's name (if visible). Tap and drag to .

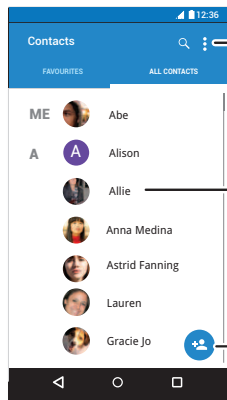

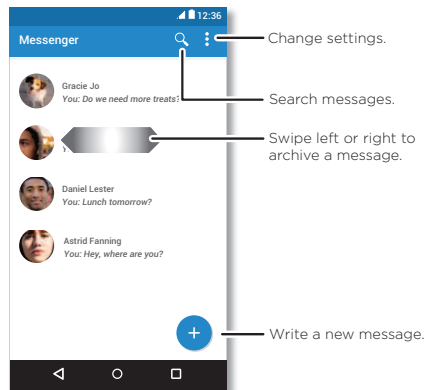

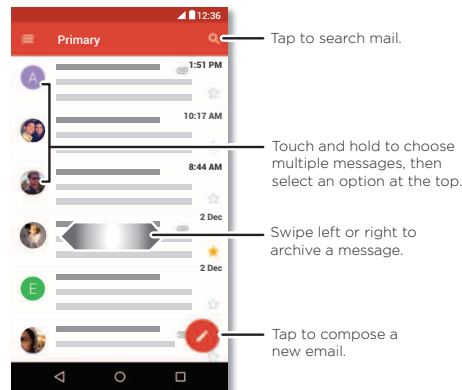

Tip: emergency alerts have a special sound and vibration that is two seconds long, followed by one second, then another one second.

To automatically **disconnect** or **reconnect** a device anytime, like a wireless headset, just turn the device off or on.

You can make your phone a Wi-Fi hotspot to provide portable, convenient internet access to other Wi-Fi enabled devices.

Note: keep it secure. To protect your phone and hotspot from unauthorised access, it is strongly recommended that you set up hotspot security (WPA2 is the most secure), including password.

Find it: apps > Settings > More > Tethering & portable hotspot and select **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot**

Note: these steps may vary depending on your network.

1 Your phone turns off Wi-Fi and uses the mobile network for internet access. Tap **Set up Wi-Fi hotspot** to set up security:

- **Network name:** enter a unique name for your hotspot.
- **Security:** select the type of security you want: **None** or **WPA2 PSK**. For **WPA2 PSK**, enter a unique password that others will need to access your Wi-Fi hotspot.

Note: WPA2 PSK is recommended by IEEE.

- **Password:** create a password with at least eight characters.

2 Tap **SAVE**.

When your Wi-Fi hotspot is active, other Wi-Fi enabled devices can connect by entering your hotspot's **Network name**, selecting a **Security** type and entering the correct **Password**.

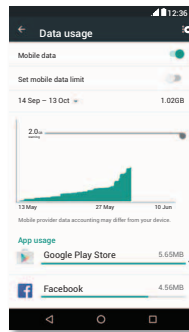

Your Android phone and tablet can work together to help you get the most out of both:

Memory card

You can choose to use your SD card as portable or internal storage:

- **Portable storage:** store your pictures, videos, audio and other media files. You can remove the SD card at any time and transfer it to another device.
- **Internal storage:** in addition to your media files, you can store downloaded apps and games. The SD card acts as an extension of the internal storage of your phone.

After you have inserted a SD card into your phone, you will be prompted to select either portable or internal storage.

To manually set your SD card to internal storage tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Storage & USB**, then select your SD card and tap Menu  > **Settings** > **Format as internal**.

Caution: if your SD card is set to internal storage, it is formatted and encrypted to protect your information. If you want to use it as portable storage or in another device, you'll need to format it. Before doing so, please remember that formatting erases all the data stored on your SD card.

To mount a memory card, simply put it into your phone (see “[Remove the battery & put in the cards](#)”).

To unmount your memory card (so you can take it out of your phone), tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Storage & USB** > **SD card** > **Unmount**.

Caution: do not remove a memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

A VPN lets you access files on a secured network (like an office network with a firewall). Contact the network administrator to ask for VPN settings and any additional apps or other requirements.

To enter VPN settings, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **More** > **VPN**. Tap  to add a new VPN. Choose the type of VPN and enter settings from the network administrator. The network is stored in the **VPN** list so you can select it whenever you need to connect.

Mobile network

You should not need to change any network settings. Contact your service provider for help.

To see network settings options, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **More** > **Mobile networks**.

To switch networks, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **More** > **Mobile networks** > **Network operators** and tap a network.

Note: your phone supports most networks. Contact your service provider for help.

Aeroplane mode

Use aeroplane mode to turn off all your wireless connections – useful when flying. Swipe the status bar down with two fingers, then tap **Aeroplane mode**.

Note: when you select aeroplane mode, all wireless services are disabled. You can then turn Wi-Fi and/or Bluetooth™ power back on, if permitted by your airline. Other wireless voice and data services (such as calls and text messages) remain off in aeroplane mode. Emergency calls to your region's emergency number can still be made.

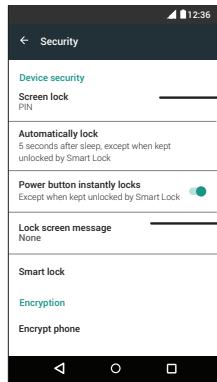

SIM card lock

Caution: if you enter an incorrect SIM PIN code three times, your phone locks your SIM card and asks for your PIN unlock code. Contact your service provider for your PIN unlock code.

You shouldn't need to use this feature, but to set a SIM card PIN that you must enter when you turn on your phone, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Security** > **Set up SIM card lock** > **Lock SIM card**.

To set your SIM PIN, enter a 4-digit code. To change your code, choose **Change SIM PIN**.

Encrypt your phone

Caution: if you forget your encryption code, you cannot recover the data stored on your phone or memory card. Encrypting your files can take an hour or more. Leave your phone plugged in and be careful not to interrupt the process.

Encryption protects the accounts, settings, apps and files on your phone, so that people cannot access them if your phone is stolen.

You shouldn't need to use this feature, but to encrypt your phone and require a PIN or password whenever you turn on your phone, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Security** > **Encrypt phone**.

Backup & restore

Find it: apps  >  **Settings** > **Backup & reset** > **Back up my data**, then tap the switch to turn it on

Your Google account data is backed up online. If you reset or replace your phone, just log in to your Google account to restore the contacts, events and other details you synced with the account.

To restore backed up data when reinstalling an app, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Backup & reset** > **Automatic restore**.

To choose what syncs with the account, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Accounts** > **Google**, tap your Google account, and select things to sync.

Note: text messages, call logs and items stored on your phone will not be restored. To restore your Google Play Store apps, see "[Take care of your apps](#)".

Reset

To reset your phone to factory settings and erase all the data on your phone, tap Apps  >  **Settings** > **Backup & reset** > **Factory data reset** > **RESET PHONE**.

Warning: all downloaded apps and user data on your phone will be deleted. Data in the cloud will not be deleted.
